Your Expectations: You should expect to be provided with quality learning experiences and be given timely feedback so you can improve the quality of your work. Discussion Questions: You are required to answer 3 discussion questions per week on the Edmodo class site. Your responses should be well articulated and show that you have given thought to the topic. Each response must be at least 100 words and not simply restate others' responses. Sometimes these will be opinion questions while at other times they will require research.

Participation: Each week you will need to comment on discussion question responses. Each comment must be at least 50 words long. You will need to comment three times a week to get full participation marks.

Assignments: All assignments will be posted through Edmodo. The assignments relate to the links, lessons and notes that are given. You may refer back to your lessons as much as you want as you complete each assignment. **Due dates are to be strictly followed!**

Tests and Quizzes: These types of assessments will be done in several ways. You may have to complete a quiz online through Edmodo, you may have a pencil and paper test, or you may be required to show a skill that you have been practicing in a set amount of time. If you miss a test day you can complete the test online at home or you may be required to complete it the next day.

General Class Rules:

Computer Use: The school computers are there to be used for school purposes. If you are using them for any other reason, you will lose your right to use them. Treat the computers with respect and do not damage them.

Cell Phone Use: Cell phones are not to be used during class and as such should not be in view during the class. **The computers and wall outlets are not for charging your personal devices. Do not plug them in!**

Food and Beverages: There is to be no food or beverages in the computer lab at any time. The only item that may be brought into the class is water in a sealed bottle that must remain on the classroom floor, NOT ON A DESK!
